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What data do we collect?

The Council collects the following data:

Personal identification information (name, email address, phone number, etc.)

How do we collect your data?

You directly provide the Council with most of the data we collect. We collect data and process data when you:

Register online or place an order for any of our products and services

Voluntarily complete a customer survey or provide feedback on any of our message boards or via email

Use or view our website via your browser's cookies

Emails into the office

How will we use your data?

Our Council collects your data so that we can:

To share your information with other organisations, with your permission

How do we store your data?

The Council securely stores your data online on our database

The Council will keep your personal contact information for a six-monthly period, or otherwise specified. Once this time period has expired, we will delete your data by secure removal from our systems.

What are your data protection rights?

The Council would like to make sure you are fully aware of all of your data protection rights. Every user is entitled to the following:

The right to access – you have the right to request The Council for copies of your personal data. We may charge you a small fee for this service

The right to rectification – You have the right to request that The Council correct any information you believe is inaccurate. You also have the right to request the Council to complete the information you believe is incomplete

The right to erasure – You have the right to request that The Council erase your personal data, under certain conditions

The right to restrict processing – You have the right to request that The Council restrict the processing of your personal data, under certain conditions

The right to object to processing – you have the right to object to The Council processing any of your personal data, under certain conditions

Cookies

Cookies are text files placed on your computer to collect standard internet log information and visitor behaviour information. When you visit our websites, we may collect information from you automatically through cookies or similar technology.

There are a number of different types of cookies, however, our website uses:

Functionality – The Council uses these cookies so that we recognise you on our website and remember your previously selected preferences. These could include what language you prefer and what location you are in. a mix of first-party and third-party cookies are used.
